



Sunnyvale and County Ramp-Up Free COVID-19 Testing

THE CITY OF SUNNYVALE is partnering with the Santa Clara County Public Health Department to offer free COVID-19 testing from Tuesday, June 30 through Thursday, July 2. The testing site is the Murphy Park building, located at 260 N. Sunnyvale Ave. Tests will be offered on a first come, first served basis from 10 a.m. to 4 p.m. each day. Testing is free and open to anyone who does not have COVID-19 symptoms and wants to be tested. No insurance or doctor note is needed, there is no age limit, and Sunnyvale residence is not required.

Said Sunnyvale Councilmember Russ Melton, "Santa Clara County is a national leader on public health during the COVID-19 emergency, and it's great to partner with them to provide this free testing in Sunnyvale. The County reports in the last week an average of 3,823 tests performed each day with an average positivity rate of 2.09%. I especially encourage our incredible essential workers

Meanwhile, the El Camino Healthcare District announced that free COVID-19 testing is available at El Camino Hospital in Mountain View for anyone who lives, works or goes to school within the boundaries of the District, which includes a significant portion of the City of Sunnyvale. Generally, the southwest portion of Sunnyvale, and a majority of the City north of El Camino Real resides within the District. To schedule a test and determine whether your residence, workplace or school is within the District, call (650) 940-7022, Monday through Friday from 7:30 a.m. to 4 p.m.

FIREWORKS ILLEGAL IN SUNNYVALE

THE CITY OF SUNNYVALE reminded residents in advance of Independence Day that fireworks of any kind are illegal in the City of Sunnyvale.

Prohibited fireworks include those classified as "safe and sane" by the California State Fire Marshall such as sparklers, fountains, snakes and caps.

Said Sunnyvale Councilmember Russ Melton, "Fireworks pose a real threat to personal safety, and are a fire hazard to our neighborhoods. Fireworks can also be a trigger for military veterans struggling with PTSD and terrifying for household pets. Hey Sunnyvale, no fireworks in 2020!"

More than 10,000 people are hospitalized each year after incidents related to Fourth of July fireworks.

City Moving Forward with Airplane Noise Monitoring System

THE CITY OF SUNNYVALE continues to move forward on the implementation of an airplane noise monitoring system.

In December 2019, the City Council approved a \$236,000 contract with Casper Airport Solutions to implement the system, which will consist of four permanent noise monitoring terminals, a public flight tracking website, a community engagement website and an internal flight/noise analysis application.

The City is working with Casper to determine the optimal locations of the four noise monitoring terminals that will most effectively capture the airplane noise of south flow approaches into San Jose International Airport as well as traffic into Moffett Field, San Carlos and Palo Alto and overflight traffic into Oakland and San Francisco airports.

A one-week test was performed between June 15 and June 22 using temporary noise monitoring terminals at seven

locations in Sunnyvale. Casper will use the data collected to make its final recommendation for the four permanent sites. The recommendation is expected from Casper in late 2020.
